Traditionally at each Christmas campout we all bring a \$10.00 toy for a boy and one for a girl to be given to an organization or charity. The last three years the recipients were the following:


2008 - Shriners Hospital

Health & Welfare

CIAMPAGLIA - Frank is doing very well considering all he went through. He has lost weight and had developed a cough, but the doctor has given him some medicine for the cough and Evelyn is trying to fatten him up! Evelyn had been having some problems with her hip and then she became dehydrated. The doctor gave her some medicine which she will be on for two weeks and she said so far this is helping her and she is starting to feel better.

CONWAY - Bill had arthroscopy surgery to his right knee yesterday and the doctor found that he had a torn meniscus and repaired it. The surgery was done as out patient and was very quick. He was put to sleep, operated on, and awake and ready to go just after two and a half hours! The marvels of modern medicine! He naturally has some pain and is able to walk around with the aid of a cane. The doctor previously told him that this knee should be good for a couple more years before he would require knee replacement, so hopefully he will have good results.

DEAL/DUDINSKY - Cotton & Juliet went up north for a family reunion and picked up a bad bronchial infection. Evidently Cotton was worse and had a lot of trouble breathing. They have been to the doctor several times and have medicine which is now helping them to feel better.

HENNING - Cerese had five stints put in to help with artery problems on September 20. While having this procedure done (normally as an out patient) she had very irregular heart beat (14) and blood pressure. They kept her in the hospital until Wednesday evening, Sep 21. They put her on some medication and her blood pressure and heart beat rate is now stabilized. She also went to the oncologist that was treating her for the bladder cancer and he gave her a clean bill of health. She will have to be tested for the cancer every three months since the type she had was a very aggressive one.

JOHNSON - Harold and Caroline are still traveling and I have been unable to reach them. I have been told that Harold is doing fairly well since having his stroke but still has some difficulties getting in and out of their coach and walking.

MORNEAULT - Albert reported at our meeting that he has been experiencing a problem with a pulled groin muscle, making it difficult for him to walk. I spoke with him today and the doctor has prescribed physical therapy treatments for two weeks and hopefully this will take care of his problem.

ORMSBY - Richard's grandson, Alex, has been in and out of the hospital about 5 times since our May campout. He is still on a liquid diet and has lost a considerable amount of weight. The latest thing they have done is put a stint in the esophagus to help with some of his problems. He had a scholarship to go to college, but this is all on hold at the present time.

POTTER - As many of you may know, Chuck & Jean's daughter was in the hospital off and on during the spring and they were unable to diagnose exactly what was wrong with her. They finally discovered she has a very debilitating disease which attacks all the organs. Although this is not cancer, she has been getting chemo treatments to help control the disease. She had her last chemo treatment yesterday, and they have definitely

helped her. This disease has put her in a wheel chair and she will be unable to work the rest of her life, so she is also getting disability. Her daughter, Jessica, who has been disabled since birth, also was having some difficulties with her bowels during the same time this spring. They were finally able to give her some sort of shot which saved her life. She is now doing very well.

ROY - An email was sent out to everyone that Bob was having back surgery on September 22. I spoke to Jean on Friday, Sep 23, and she reported that the doctor was pleased with the surgery, and Bob had screws put in disks 2 thru 7 and would have to wear a neck brace for about six weeks. He is now in a rehabilitation center and starting his physical therapy. He is expected to be in rehab for about two weeks if all goes well.

ZECHER - Lorraine has had some anxiety issues over the last few years, and over the summer months had some stress which was causing her to have heart palpitations/fluttering and just not feeling well. After finally visiting her doctor she learned that these anxiety attacks and stress have caused damage to the muscle of her heart. They now have her on some medication which she hopes will allow them to travel back to FL in a few weeks. She also had a small skin cancer removed from her neck and leg.

Well as someone put it during our meeting on Saturday, it looks like the members of TBS are all falling apart!!! The good thing about writing all of this for you is that when I finally got to the bottom, the final results were that most everyone was improving - which is GREAT news! The other thing about reporting about the various ailments - I think I might apply for a medical transcript job (just kidding for sure)!! We do ask that you continue to keep all our TBS family in your thoughts and prayers and to keep those that are still traveling safe. Please let us know if I forgot to mention anyone or if there is someone you would like to add to the list.
